School vision and context

School vision statement

Success through excellence, opportunity and belonging.

At Kelso Public School we create a culture of belonging and hold high expectations for learning so that we fulfill the educational aspirations of every student. Together with the community we will connect, succeed, thrive and learn.

School context

Kelso Public School's teachers and support staff are committed to quality teaching and creating positive, engaging learning environments. The school culture of Success, Excellence, Opportunity and Belonging allows students to engage in a broad range of activities. The school has an enrolment of 382 students and is inclusive of 149 Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students, 14 Languages other than English and 91 students with disabilities. We currently have 12 mainstream classes, 9 inclusive education classes, and an Early Intervention class. The diverse needs of our students are met by the employment of additional specialist staff and through partnerships with the local Aboriginal Education Consultative Group, Parents and Citizens association, and other community agencies. Our School Excellence Plan includes a focus on explicit teaching to drive student achievement in reading and numeracy. A systematic approach to learning culture and engagement promotes students' attendance and wellbeing.

Purpose

To strengthen teachers' practice in explicit teaching, assessment and differentiation, in order to maximise student learning outcomes.

Improved numeracy outcomes

There is a whole school focus on demonstrating growth in numeracy to improve the achievement levels of all students.

 To achieve an uplift of 10 points in year 5 NAPLAN numeracy mean scaled score by 2027.

Improved reading outcomes

There is a whole school focus on demonstrating growth in reading to improve the achievement levels of all students.

 To achieve an uplift of 8 points in year 5 NAPLAN reading mean scaled score by 2027.

Initiatives

Explicit Teaching

The school implements a whole-school approach to explicit teaching, grounded in the NSW Department of Education's Explicit Teaching strategy, to ensure high-quality, evidence-based instructional practices are embedded across all learning environments. This initiative builds teacher capacity through targeted professional learning and collaborative practice, aiming to improve student learning outcomes and achieve the school's strategic improvement measures.

Monitoring Student Achievement

This initiative builds teacher expertise in utilising student achievement data, gathered through a range of assessment strategies, to identify skill gaps and areas for extension, informing targeted teaching and reflection on teaching effectiveness. It also supports ongoing capacity building to drive improved student outcomes.

Success criteria for this strategic direction

- All students demonstrate measurable growth in literacy and numeracy outcomes, evidenced through internal and external assessments.
- Teachers collaboratively analyse student data and engage in professional dialogue about effective strategies to address identified needs.
- Teachers consistently implement evidence-based explicit teaching strategies, which are visible in lesson observations, program documentation, and classroom practice.
- Formative assessment is embedded in all classrooms, with students regularly receiving timely, specific feedback informing their next learning steps.
- Data is systematically collected, analysed, and used by teachers to inform targeted teaching practices and monitor student progress.
- Differentiated learning experiences are evident in all classrooms, ensuring every student access appropriately challenging tasks tailored to their learning needs.
